In just over one month CWC 2018 will flag off in Bangkok and for seven days a bunch of people will ride over 700 km together, eat together, share rooms together - some are long-time friends, some meet each other for the first time - but at the end of the ride on February 3, 2018 they all will share the same memories of an unforgettable experience. We have now 15 riders signed up - one more is still considering - (and possibly 8 or 9 additional riders for the last day, one day ride into the Baan Fah Sighy Children Home for the closing ceremony). And the group could not be more diversified; we have 4 ladies, 11 gents; 8 are long distance ride veterans, 7 first timers; 7 of us are over 50 years old, 3 of us are even over 60 years old and we come from 7 different nationalities. As diversified we may be, we are all united in our endeavour to do something extra ordinary with our lives and to bring hope for a better life to some beautiful children in North Thailand and Myanmar.

In a few days it's Christmas; Christmas has a different meaning for different people. And although it is a holiday observed mainly by Christians, I always felt that it brings a certain period of calm and reflection to the world. And I think that this is exactly what we may need - the bit of calm and reflection to give us pause to look at our lives and realise, how blessed we are. I can't guarantee anything but I'll give it a good crack.





Just go to <a href="https://www.cyclistswithcompassion.com/donate">https://www.cyclistswithcompassion.com/donate</a> and click on the yellow "Donate" (pic 1) button to open the CWC-dedicated donation portal on EAI's website. There click the blue "Donate" button (Pic 2), which will open the interactive donation form (pic 3). Checking the CWC rider box will open a field, in which you can name the CWC rider in who's honour you donate. You can also specify here that your donation should go to the Baan Fah Sighy Children home or the Border Project or leave it empty in case you do not want to specify either. The donation amount is in Australian Dollar, but the donation form provides a currency calculator. Here you can get estimation, on how much the donation amount would be in your home currency.

After pressing "Donate Now" you will be routed to safe credit card facility to make payment of the donation (pic 4). For those that prefer to use PayPal, please use the yellow "Donate" button on the EAI CWC-dedicated donation page (pic 2).
